I currently carry National cards for the GVHS, GHSA, GHRA, American Driving Society, PtHA, National Show Pony, Modern Shetland, Modern Pleasure Shetland, Classic Shetland, American Miniature Horse Registry and American Miniature Horse Association.

My family showed Arabians, Morgans, and Saddlebreds on the Class A circuit, and I owned Michigan's High Point Arabian. On average, I judge around 20 shows per year. I have judged more than fifteen Gypsy Shows, as well as the Gypsy Challenge in Tunica, Mississippi. The Mississippi State Fair twice, AMHR Nationals seven times, Halflinger Nationals twice, National Halflinger Futurity and the Little Celebration for the Tennessee Walking Horse. I am also an evaluator for the Halflingers.

I have judged many different open shows for many different aspects of Equine organizations. I have more than fifty years of hands on experience.
